CUBE Annual Conference Safety Protocols and Requirements

Please read the following prior to attending the CUBE Annual Conference. Many of you will be returning to your school districts and interacting with children who may not be vaccinated. Please do your part to keep other attendees from contracting the virus and spreading it once home.

COVID Vaccines, Testing Requirements, Health Checks, and Masks

All CUBE participants will be required to show proof of at least one dose of a coronavirus vaccine or a negative COVID test within 72 hours (Mon. Sept. 13 – Tues. Sept. 15) of the start of the event for entry. All CUBE Annual Conference participants must wear a mask indoors regardless of vaccination status, except when actively eating or drinking.

Make your experience run more smoothly by uploading your proof of vaccination status or negative test using the private, secure, HealthShield chatbot system prior to coming onsite. View HealthShield FAQs.

Uploading instructions:

Step 1: Scan the QR code.

Step 2: Respond to the text with "UPLOAD TOOL" to follow the instructions to upload your vaccination status or negative test results.

Alternatively, you may bring your vaccination card or your test results with you.

Daily Onsite Health Check

Step 1: Scan the QR code and complete the daily health screen.

Step 2: Visit the onsite Health Desk and show your green check mark from your phone.

Step 3: Collect your wristband for the day.



Any attendee who does not provide proof of at least one dose of a COVID vaccine or a negative COVID test within the 72-hour window or fails a health screen will not be permitted into the event venue.
