



Council of School Attorneys Financial Hardship Policy

The NSBA Council of School Attorneys (COSA) is dedicated to providing high-quality continuing legal education to attorneys interested in its course offerings. To that end, COSA has established a financial hardship policy for attorneys who are unable to afford the course tuition but are interested in CLE courses offered by or in conjunction with COSA. Factors to be considered include employment status, and fee reductions on a sliding scale for attorneys with annual incomes of \$35,000 or less.

Unemployed	Full Scholarship
Income up to \$15,000	75% Discount
Income \$15,000-\$35,000	50% Discount
Income Above \$35,000	No Discount

All requests must be in writing and are kept confidential. Requests must be received at least 30 days prior to the start date of the CLE program.
