## Individuals With Disabilities Education Act OUICK FACTS\*

- Approximately 6.9 million children with disabilities will be served in Fiscal Year 2019.
- School districts typically may use up to 15 percent of their IDEA allocation for Coordinated Early Intervening Services (CEIS).
- The current federal investment in special education and related services for children with disabilities is less than 16 percent – an average of less than \$1,760 per student.
